General Matters

1. Updates on COVID-19 Situation

Schools have re-opened for Term 2 on Monday, 23 March as planned. MOE has shared the key considerations behind this decision through the media. We would like to highlight the 3 key points:

i. Science – Scientific evidence shows that COVID-19 does not affect the young as much as adults, and that the young are not spreaders of the virus. If schools are closed, many students may not stay at home and expose themselves to more risk. Schools therefore remain safe places for students.

- Disruption School closure will disrupt many lives, especially for parents who are both working, with no domestic help and limited childcare options. Parents who are healthcare workers and providers of essential services will be much more assured if their children are meaningfully engaged in school, in a safe and healthy environment. Keeping our healthcare system strong is paramount in the fight against COVID-19.
- iii. Precautions Healthcare experts were consulted and many additional precautionary measures have been put in place, including a LOA policy, suspension of after-school activities and fixed exam-style seating in classrooms. Implemented together with current measures already in place, these serve as a robust layer of defence to protect our students, and complement the natural defence children may already have.

MOH announced that 14-day Stay Home Notice (SHN) would be issued to returning Singapore Residents and visitors from all countries from 20 March 2359 hrs. To further protect our schools, MOE has implemented additional precautionary measures by issuing a 14-day Leave of Absence (LOA) to students and staff who have been out of Singapore on or after 14 March. Day Zero of the 14 days of the LOA will commence from the date of their return to Singapore, and affected students should keep away from schools.

All affected students (on SHN, Approved Absence (AA), or LOA) will be supported via home-based learning. We assure you that all schools have been thoroughly cleaned and enhanced hygiene measures are in place. MOE and the school will continue to monitor the situation closely.

To further safe-guard our school community, we seek your assistance in the following:

- i. If any household member(s) has returned from overseas within the past 14 days (i.e. issued SHN/AA/LOA) and develops a fever or starts to display flu-like symptoms, please ensure that he/she gets necessary medical attention as soon as possible. While waiting for the outcome of medical diagnosis, we seek your understanding and cooperation in informing us immediately and keeping your child/ward at home. Please be assured that the school will minimise disruption to your child's learning by making arrangements for Home-Based Learning.
- ii. Please remind your child to exercise good personal hygiene practices, social responsibility and safe distancing measures **even when they are not school**. Students are strongly encouraged to avoid crowded places, gatherings and situations of prolonged mixing that could increase the risk of interclass or inter-school transmission.

With the recent COVID-19 developments, the school would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your understanding and prompt responses thus far. We seek your continued understanding to look out for further updates and announcements made via Parents Gateway (PG). As some parents / guardians have yet to come onboard PG, we urge these parents / guardians to do so as soon as possible, so that you can receive timely updates from the school and MOE, as well as access important functions such as travel declarations.

In line with the latest safe distancing measures, changes will be made to school events/activities as follows:

ST1: EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING & LEARNING

3. Teaching & Learning Updates

Over the March school holidays, students would have engaged themselves in some holiday homework. The school emphasises that "the aim of homework is to encourage and support students' learning. It is to allow students to demonstrate mastery of the concepts taught in class so that teachers can utilise the information to plan for future lessons. Homework allows students to take ownership of their learning and inculcate good study habits." Please refer to our school website for more details on our Homework Policy. The school also puts up information on assigned holiday homework at the end of each school term. Your support in ensuring that your child / ward has completed all of his/her holiday homework is much appreciated.

Students will receive their first Progress Report for 2020 in the first week of Term 2. The assessments reflected constitute 10-15% of the overall score for Secondary 1 to 3 students (please refer to Student Handbook for details). Students are encouraged to identify and work on their strengths as well as areas of growth with the respective subject teachers, who are also mindful of these factors.

We will work with parents closely to help our students learn and grow. We aim to focus on students' holistic development, which includes building resilience (including self-discipline as well as managing and overcoming setbacks), nurturing a growth mindset, and not just academic outcomes alone.

4. NO Remediation Programme for All Levels (for the time-being)

As all after-school programmes are to be suspended till 3 April to mitigate the health situation, there will not be any remedial sessions for Secondary 1-3 students during this period. Nevertheless, your child can sign up for consultations with his/her teachers after school. Consultations will take the form of a maximum 10 students per teacher. Teachers will also take necessary precautions and record the particulars as well as seating arrangement of every participating student.

Once the suspension is lifted, the school will re-introduce our Remediation Programme.

5. Secondary 4 & 5 Academic Matters

Consultation Schedule for Secondary 4E/4NA/5N

The school will be providing consultations for our graduating classes on a sign-up basis. Consultations will take the form of a maximum 10 students per teacher. Teachers will also take necessary precautions and record the particulars as well as seating arrangement of every participating student.

The consultation schedule will end on Thursday, 30 April, before the start of the Mid-Year Examinations. We seek your support and assistance in ensuring that your child signs up for these consultations should they need this form of support from our teachers.

Please refer to the attached consultation schedule for details. Our pre-planned Extended Academic Programme for 4EXP/5NA students (which takes place in the afternoons) will supersede the consultation plans and schedule once the suspension of after-school activities is lifted. Parents will be duly notified.

We appreciate your cooperation in partnering with the school to help your child achieve academic excellence at the GCE O- and N-Level Examinations.

End-May/June Academic Programme

The school has a June Academic Programme schedule planned for all 4EXP/5NA students as we work with them towards achieving excellence. Selected 4NA students who are unable to achieve their learning goals for the Mid-Year Examinations will be required to attend a Remediation Programme.

All lessons will be conducted between Tuesday, 2 June and Tuesday, 9 June. We seek your cooperation in ensuring that your child attends these sessions.

All Secondary 4EXP, 4NA and 5NA students are also required to sit for Timed Practices for English Language and Mathematics. This is to provide them with an important opportunity to perform under timed conditions similar to the National Examinations. Students are also expected to do revision over the June holidays. Targeted feedback and intervention strategies will then be given to the students during lessons when school reopens for Semester 2.

The English Language Timed Practice will be conducted on Tuesday, 9 June 1.30-6.00pm (similar to National Examination conditions) and the Mathematics Timed Practice will be conducted on Friday, 26 June 8.00-10.00am (4NA) and 8.00-10.30am (4EXP/5NA). More information will be given to the students at a later date.

Coursework Preparation for Art and Design & Technology (D&T) for Secondary 4/5

Coursework requires your child / ward to produce a quality piece of work over the course of the academic year. The national deadlines for submission are in Term 3.

The coursework examinations also require a significant amount of preparation, a time-plan outlining the various stages of the coursework and their respective deadlines. Timelines will be issued to your child by their respective subject teachers. The school places great importance on students' adherence to the stipulated timelines. This is to ensure that students give themselves adequate time to prepare and meet the rigorous requirements of coursework submission for the national examinations. Students are strongly advised to complete their coursework by the timelines given for every stage of the coursework. Early completion before the deadlines will also ensure that they can better prepare for

We would also like to take this opportunity to reassure parents / guardians that the school will arrange makeup sessions for all Secondary 4/5 students offering coursework (including Elements of Business Skills) and who are affected by SHN/AA/LOA. These sessions will be conducted in a timely manner before the national submission deadlines, and teachers will be informing students on the details upon their return to school.

6. Mid-Year Examination for Secondary 2, 4 & 5 students

other academic subjects.

The mid-year examinations (written papers) will be conducted from Monday, 4 May to Wednesday, 13 May. Please note that selected English Language and Mother Tongue Language papers will be conducted for Secondary 4/5 students from Monday, 27 April.

The detailed examination timetable and listing of the topics to be examined will be uploaded onto the school website soon. We encourage parents to work with your child / ward to put in place a regular revision schedule leading up to the examinations. Please work with the school to monitor your child / ward's physical and emotional well-being and provide them with encouragement and support.

All CCA activities for Secondary 2 & 4/5 will be suspended from Term 2 Week 5 onwards till the end of the examination period. Students need not attend school on marking day on Thursday, 14 May. Lessons will resume on Friday, 15 May.

7. Post-Examination Activities

Post-Examination Activities (abridged version of our signature Innovation Week) for Secondary 1 to 3 students will be held from Tuesday, 26 May to Thursday, 28 May.

The 3-day programme will focus on experiential classroom learning within different subject areas at the respective levels. The objectives are to enhance our students' knowledge and understanding through discovery and to help them relate what they have learnt to the real world.

Students will follow the usual reporting and dismissal time, unless otherwise stated.

Values-in-Action Programmes

Values-in-Action programmes will still continue in alternative formats. It remains important for our students to develop as servant leaders by understanding the needs of their peers and the larger community. Physical community engagement will be suspended for the Secondary 2 and 4/5 projects but students will continue to engage their community through different platforms such as social media.

CCE Lessons/Assembly Programmes

The CCE curriculum has been adjusted to take into account learning points from the current situation. Class Mentors are engaging students to learn important values through this real-life situation, by employing a series of Just-in-Time packages from MOE and other CCE lessons. Mass assembly programmes, e.g. International Friendship Day assembly programme etc. will be modified into class-based programmes to ensure that students continue to appreciate the fundamental values of diversity, but in a safe social setting.

CCA Updates

Please be informed that when CCA sessions are allowed to resume, there will be a change in the schedules and timings. The rationale for these changes is that while the National School Games, public performances and other external school activities have been suspended, students should continue to hone their interests and talents as well as develop their social skills, leadership and character.

In addition, please note that Secondary 4/5 students have stood down from CCA at the end of Term 1 and Secondary 2 students will stand down after Friday, 24 April (in preparation for Mid-Year Examinations). CCA Activities will continue for Secondary 1 & 3 students during this period. However, adjustments will be made to the frequency of activities. More details will be shared at a later date.

10. Discipline Reminders

As per usual school practice, the school conducts regular grooming checks to ensure that our students are appropriately attired and ready for learning. Term 2's grooming checks will be conducted in Weeks 1 and 6. Students who are unable to adhere to school grooming rules will either be sent home, or will have their grooming rectified on-the-spot (e.g. purchasing proper socks / school shoelaces).

Please note that the school will be inviting a barber down to school in Weeks 1 and 6 to provide students who have inappropriate hair length/style with an affordable and neat haircut, at the student's expense.

Parents and students may refer to the Student Handbook for school rules related to grooming.

OTHER MATTERS

11. Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Immunisation Programme for Secondary 3, 4 & 5 Girls

As mentioned in Termly Letter 01/2020, there will be two doses of the vaccination for the girls.

As the upper Secondary girls have taken their first dose on either 29 or 30 January 2020, we have scheduled the second dose to be on Thursday, 2 April. This is the latest date possible as the overall effectiveness of the vaccination will be affected if the second dose is not taken within 2.5 months.

The vaccination will be taken during curriculum hours. Parents who have concerns may contact the school or Year Head for clarification.

12. Secondary 2 Meet-The-Parents Session

The Secondary 2 Meet-The-Parents session was scheduled to take place on Friday, 27 March (see Student Handbook). The school is unable to organise any mass gathering during this period, and will be uploading the relevant materials such as 2021 Secondary 3 Subject Combinations and related FAQs.

The school will share more information with Secondary 2 parents via Parents Gateway shortly. We will also collate parents' queries related to the materials shared and present our responses accordingly.

13. Importance of Travel Declaration

MOH had issued an update on additional precautionary measures on 15 March, advising all Singapore Residents to defer all non-essential travel. On 18 March, MOH advised against all travel abroad and on 19 March, MOE announced 14-day LOA for all staff and students who returned from overseas, regardless of country or mode of entry, on or after Saturday 14 March.

With these developments as the health situation evolved rapidly, the school had to devote considerable resources to reminding and checking with parents / guardians on *timely and accurate travel declaration*. We sincerely appeal for all parents / guardians to declare your child's / ward's and your family's travel plans for the upcoming June holidays as we continue our efforts to ensure a healthy and safe school environment in light of the COVID-19 situation. Your support with timely and accurate travel information will allow the school to plan and take the necessary precautions.

You will be notified via Parents Gateway in May to declare your child/ward's travel plans. A 'nil' declaration is also required if your child /ward will not be travelling. We seek the cooperation of all parents / guardians to update and submit accurate travel declarations on time.

Secondary 4/5 Consultation Schedule for 2020 (Term 2 Week 1 - 6)
